Cluster Achievements

Internationalisation is the key to exploitation of SME potential – Clusters can make it happen!

The message is crystal clear when you ask Jacob Mogensen, Manager of The Danish Innovation Network for Biomass (INBIOM), how European SMEs can succeed internationally and whether it is something clusters and networks should be involved in. "National markets are relatively small for most SMEs compared with the cost of developing new technologies. Foreign involvement increased the demand of new technologies – but just as important – also already existing ones. Clusters can be the missing link in terms of facilitating the process and essential to the success of SMEs".



Since 2011 Jacob Mogensen has been in charge of INBIOM and the cluster focused on helping Danish SMEs to establish contacts and do business in China. INBIOM succeeded in technology and knowledge transfers, concrete orders, and even establishment of new common companies across Danish and Chinese stakeholders. The secret behind INBIOM's success is a long, focused effort combined with the right partners both in Denmark and in China.

News from the cluster community

Interesting insights into business models of cluster management organisations

The business model development for cluster management organisations was intensively investigated in the Masters thesis of Nadja Dehne from Silicon Saxony. Besides literature analysis, a survey was made among 55 cluster management organisations.

It turned out that their differentiation happens first and foremost at the level of services that also play an increasing role in the financing of the organisation itself. The survey revealed that in fact services contribute by 20% in average to the revenues of a cluster organisation.
