## Logistics

### Hotels:

In the registration, you have the option to ask CEBR to book you a room, and invoice it together with the annual meeting fees, but you can also do it on your own. Although the venue is on the outskirts, we recommend you book in the centre, as we will arrange shuttles to the two main hotels. Here below some recommendations from our partner HBIO.

#### a) Electra Metropolis

About €120. This is smack in the center (2 minutes form Syntagma Square - where the parliament etc are) and close to Plaka , Acropolis etc etc.

#### b) Divani Caravel

Around €150. This is close to the Kolonaki area (10 -15 mins walk),

#### c) President Hotel

Around 80€. In the center-ish but not the best location if people want to go for a walk into centre of town. There is of course a Metro station nearby. It is a budget solution.

#### d) St George Lycabetus

€ 120. This is right in the center of Kolonaki area (below Lycabetus which is a landmark hill in Athens with a nice little church and funicular to take you there) and also 15-20 minutes walk to Syntagma/Plaka.
