

Why Clusters and What Works?

Following the successful 2016 conference, *Driving Regional Competitiveness through Innovative Clusters to Bolster National Prosperity* held in Adelaide last June, this year's gathering will again be in Adelaide on 3 October due to the state's continuing support for a cluster-based program for economic development and some stand-out cluster success stories.

Last year the President of TCI-Network, Dr Christian Ketels, joined us in Adelaide and left with a clear message: "As globalisation accelerates, clusters strengthen the collaboration required for increased innovation and connectivity, crucial for upgrading the competitiveness of companies, regions and nations."

The Oceania Chapter aims to convene larger events with international speakers on a biennial basis. This year's event will be an opportunity to catch up and share cluster success stories and failures around the theme: Why Clusters & What Works? Details out shortly.

As a next step in engaging around WA's clusters, a sell-out Industry Cluster Summit was held in Perth on 17 May, organised by the WA Dept of Regional Development, National Energy Resources Australia (one of the six national Industry Growth Centres) and TCI Network Oceania. Keynotes included The Hon. Alannah MacTieman, WA's Minister for Regional Development, and from the TCI Oceania network, Ifor Ffowcs-Williams and Jacqueline Brinkman. While in Perth, Ifor led two cluster training workshops with 60 participants drawn from NERA's network and regional economic development agencies across WA.

Australia's First Bronze Label Cluster

Our congratulations are extended to South Australia's Medical Devices cluster, Meddev SA, recently awarded a Bronze label benchmark by the European Cluster Excellence Initiative (ECEI). This is the first Oceania and Australian cluster to be benchmarked by the European Secretariat for Cluster Analysis. TCI2017: Bogota, Columbia

The Future of Clusters through Cross-country and Cross-region Collaboration is the theme of this year's 20th anniversary annual TCI global conference to be held in Bogota, Colombia, 7-9 November.

Bogota has been working on cluster development agendas for the past five years, led by the Bogota Chamber of Commerce. Today, the city has 13 cluster initiatives in the following sectors: apparel; jewelry; footwear, leather and leather products; business and events-related tourism; gastronomy; music; creative and content-related industries; dairy; software and IT; energy; graphic communications; cosmetics; and health.

This year's conference will focus on collaboration and complementarity alliances between developed and developing countries for better policies, better business and better management practices, and identifying cluster emerging trends.
